

# MSU Continues as Host Institution for Hubert H. Humphrey Program



MSU will continue to host scholars in areas related to economic development through the prestigious Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program. Having been one of two host institutions in the area of economic development since the 2002-03 academic year, the university was pleased to learn that it has been accepted for a second five year period. There are currently 15 U.S. universities participating in the Fulbright-related program, which brings mid-career professionals from countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean, the Middle East, Europe, and Eurasia to the United States for a year of intensive graduate-level study and related professional experience.
